224. CARE OF SCHOOL PROPERTY/OBLIGATIONS	
1. Purpose	The Joint Operating Committee believes that the center should help students learn to respect property and develop feelings of pride in community institutions and financial obligations.
2. Authority	The Joint Operating Committee charges each student in the center with responsibility for the proper care of the school property, school supplies and equipment entrusted to his/her use and for meeting financial obligations.
SC 777 Pol. 218, 233	It is the policy of the Joint Operating Committee that students who willfully cause damage to school property shall be subject to disciplinary measures. Students and others who damage or deface school property may be prosecuted and punished under law. Parents/Guardians shall be held accountable for the actions of the student.
SC 1338	The Joint Operating Committee may report to appropriate juvenile authorities any student whose damage of school property is serious or chronic in nature. In no case shall referral to juvenile authorities be made without prior notification to the student's parent/guardian.
3. Delegation of Responsibility SC 109, 801	<p>The Administrative Director or designee shall develop procedures to implement this policy which include rules for safekeeping and accounting of textbooks, supplies and equipment; an established schedule of fines for lost or damaged textbooks, supplies and equipment; and methods for collecting and recording student financial obligations.</p> <p>The Administrative Director shall submit a report on incidences of vandalism to the Joint Operating Committee on each occurrence.</p> <p>Vandalism reports shall include the number and kind of incident, cost to the school, and related information the Administrative Director deems necessary.</p> <p>Mobile Equipment Operations students must have all financial obligations to the school satisfied prior to CDL testing. The Coordinator of the Mobile Equipment program will determine if all financial obligations to the school have been met.</p>
