ADULT/POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION DRUG AND ALCOHOL POLICY</p> <p>The students and staff of the Greater Johnstown Career & Technology Center (GJCTC) are committed to an alcohol-free and drug-free environment. Illegal possession, or use of or involvement with such substances on center grounds shall not be tolerated. If an instructor suspects a student is under the influence of drugs or alcohol, the instructor reserves the right to refuse to allow the student to operate any equipment or engage in any training activities.</p> <p>The Joint Operating Committee establishes the following as violations of this policy:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Possession, use, or distribution of illegal drugs and/or controlled substances. 2. Possession, use, or distribution of paraphernalia containing evidence of such substances. 3. Possession, use, or distribution of alcoholic beverages. <p>Possession is defined as being present at the time of discovery of drugs and/or alcohol.</p> <p>Students who possess, use, or distribute illegal drugs, controlled substances, drug paraphernalia, or alcoholic beverages while on center grounds or at any center-sponsored activity or trip will be reported to the local police department.</p> <p>If found guilty of drug or alcohol offenses, the student will be dismissed for the remainder of the school term with no refund of tuition. No diploma or certificate of completion will be issued to the student.</p> <p><u>Appeal Process</u></p> <p>If a student feels s/he has been unfairly dismissed from a program at the center, the student has the right to file a grievance following the grievance procedure as outlined in the latest edition of the GJCTC Adult Education Student Handbook.</p>
